The Bangladeshi chapter promoted schools for girls and described education as a "transformative vehicle".

President Kathryn Jones announced that the Board agreed to join the District Gundaker Foundation. The Club will pay \$10 for each club member annually. Club members can contribute more by going to the Gundaker website. Offsetting this fee, Kathryn said the District annual assessment has been reduced from \$75 per member to \$37. This reduction will be reflected in lower dues.
